Sixth Form Dress Code

Sixth Form students must recognise their responsibility in acting as ambassadors to the school and as positive role models at all times, including in the area of school dress. At Prince Henry's we expect all students to be smart and well-presented and, to this end, we have adopted a dress code for Post-16 students which should reflect the high standards of presentation in younger year groups.

Clothing and appearance should not reflect the extremes of youth culture and should be appropriate at all times. Where such extremes are evident or judged to be inappropriate for an 11-18 school setting, the Head teacher reserves the right to remove the student from normal lessons.

Boys and Girls	Trousers	Tailored, plain colour trousers are permitted – no denim, jeans-style, tight-fitting styles such as leggings, treggings and jeggings, tracksuit bottoms, shorts or cargo pants.
Girls	Skirt	Tailored plain colour or with discreet pattern, worn between mid-calf and 5 cm above the knee. Lycra, 'body con' (tight fitting) skirts should not be worn as these tend to ride up to an unacceptable length.
	Dress	Smart, plain or with discreet pattern, worn between mid calf and 5 cm above the knee. Again the Lycra 'body con' style should not be worn. Strappy summer dresses are not suitable.
Boys	Shirt	Tailored with collar and no large logo. Plain colour or with discreet pattern. The shirt should be worn tucked-in.
	Tie	Smart tie, done up to the collar.
Girls	Shirt or blouse	Tailored with collar and no large logo. Plain colour or with discreet pattern. Blouses should be worn buttoned up. Sleeveless and see-through tops are not considered appropriate. Casual lumberjack-style shirts are not considered smart.
Both	Jumper or Cardigan	Plain with no large logos. No sweatshirts or hoodies.
Girls	Make up	Discreet make up in natural colours only.
Both	Footwear	Plain smart shoes or boots – heels no higher than 5cm No trainers, mules, sandals or UGG style boots. Doc Martin style boots worn with a skirt or dress or outside trousers are not considered smart.
	Belt	Plain with no large buckles.
	Hair	Hairstyles must not reflect the extremes of youth culture and should be in natural colours only.
	Outdoor wear	No outdoor wear such as coats, hats, scarves and gloves may be worn in the building before 3.00pm. Denim jackets, sweatshirts, baseball caps or hoodies must not be worn at any time within the school grounds.
	Identity badge	Photo ID must be worn visibly at all times while on school premises.
	Piercings and tattoos	No visible piercings other than for earrings worn in the ear lobe. No visible tattoos.
